

Accommodation (barrier free / 100% wheelchair accessible)

The Chang Noi Resort has 8 bungalows approximately 35m² each. Each unit is equipped with a barrier free (wheelchair accessible) bathroom and rain forest shower, hair dryer, air-conditioner, Internet TV, refrigerator, European electrical outlets, a safe, 12m² patio and seating area.

The sliding door for entrance can be reached by stairs and a ramp for wheelchair users.

Additionally, each unit has a sleeper couch that can comfortably provide sleeping arrangement for the third person. Our 35m² bungalows are spacious, comfortably fitted with double beds or king-size bed customized furniture reflecting a Thai flair.




Additionally, the resort has 3 houses.


Two houses have two units (mirror-inverted) with the same equipment as the bungalows (Paphatsara/Patthama and Ramona/Korina)







The third house, **Lilo**, is the largest, approximately 42 m².





Swimming pool (barrier free)

The resort has a barrier free access to the swimming pool with 72m² combined with a plunge pool, waterfall, outdoor shower, and shaded areas.

Restaurant

Our restaurant has an open terrace with a kitchen where we serve our customers breakfast and dinner. We can also offer lunch on request. Breakfast is served between 07:30-10:30 both Thai and European food. Dinner is offered from the menus of local restaurants. Our evening mealtimes start from approx. 18:15. Orders for dinner from external restaurants must be placed by approx. 16:00. If no orders are placed with us, we assume that our guests will be catering for themselves or eating out.

We offer a wide range of drinks such as orange juice, soda water, soft drinks such as Coke, Sprite, Schweppes etc. For alcoholic drinks, we offer red and white wine by the glass and our range of beers includes Thai beer such as Singha, Chang, and Leo. Coffee or hot tea are also available. Still water from a dispenser is available free of charge.

Additional services

Transport service between the international airports of Bangkok (Suvarnabhumi and Don Muang) and our resort will be arranged on demand. The driving time will be about 3 ½ to 4 hours on normal traffic conditions. In case of traffic jams the time could be up to 6 hours. Special transport service with mini-bus and ramp could be provided for persons who use their wheelchair at any time.

Local transport service can be arranged on request (e.g., to Hua Hin town and other places of interest or sightseeing tours).

If you would like to have your laundry washed, we offer a laundry service.

Our location is exactly one (1) km away from the beach of Pak Nam Pran. Therefore, we have also one (1) beach-wheelchair available in the resort.

We also offer support for all questions about visa documents (i.e., visa extension, 90 days report, etc.).

Sightseeing

Holiday Inn sunset excursion

Barrier-free, easily accessible with a wheelchair. Duration approx. 2 hours, booking required. Sunset between 17:30 - 18:15 depending on the time of year.

Admission is free, but it is advisable to order at least one drink. Transfer from Chang Noi Resort to Holiday Inn about 30 minutes. The terrace is on the 27th floor and the waiting time for the elevator can be as long as 5 minutes. Unfortunately, wheelchair users are not allowed on the glass platform, but the view over the city of Hua Hin is still fantastic.



Monsoon Valley Vineyard

Transfer to Monsoon Valley Vineyard about 50 to 60 minutes. The entrance fee is THB 200 per person but will be deducted from your consumption in the restaurant.

The total area planted in Hua Hin is 700 rai (110 hectares) and was established in 2003.

Monsoon Valley was founded in 2001 by Chalerm Yoovidhya, a wine-loving entrepreneur with a vision to create a Thai wine culture. Upon returning from his studies abroad, Chalerm saw potential in growing grapes in his beloved native Thailand and set out to show the world that great wines can be crafted even at the 13th latitude of the northern hemisphere.

Varietals such as Colombard and Chenin Blanc, Sangiovese, Rondo and Shiraz were found to thrive here. Added later were Muscat, Dornfelder, Merlot, Cabernet Sauvignon and Sauvignon Blanc varietals.

The restaurant of Monsoon Valley offers a lot of dishes and snacks.

For wine lovers, a wine tasting of white, rosé and red wine is recommended and the wine store offers a wide range of different first-class wines from there.

Hua Hin railway station

Hua Hin railway station was built in 1925 for the Bangkok - Hua Hin line. A year later, the waiting house was built for the royal family from Bangkok to the summer palace in Hua Hin, where the royal family always enjoyed their summer vacation.

Artist Village Hua Hin

Partially barrier-free, small steps. Transfer from Resort to Artist Village about 45 to 60 minutes. Duration of stay approx. 3 hours. Restaurant and coffee are open. An entrance fee of THB 100.00 is charged at the back.


Night market Hua Hin

Daily open from 18:00 nearly midnight. Barrier-free. Also, fine for evening dinner on the way. There are also some live bands for entertainment at the restaurants closed to the market.

The chocolate factory is very close to the night market and has a store and a restaurant where Thai and international dishes are available. To reach the factory there are stairs and ramps on side. The ramps are very steep, and you need a strong person to support you. Once you have reached the entrance, everything is barrier-free.

Khao Kalok beach

Khao Kalok beach or Naresuan Beach is a beach that stretches from Pranburi Beach to Khao Kalok. The soft brown sandy beach makes you feel comfortable with the cool breeze and quiet atmosphere. There is a small hill to the south of the beach shaped like a skull, so locals call it Khao Kalok beach (skull beach). There are no restaurants lined up along the beach, so it can be said that it is a private beach that is perfect for a truly peaceful relaxation. This beach is only one (1) km away from our resort.

Sam roi yod beach

Life in Sam Roi Yod is slow, amidst natural surroundings and clean ocean air.

Sam Roi Yod derives its name from the ring of limestone peaks that encapsulate the area. Literally translated, they are the “three hundred peaks” of the craggy limestone formations.

The beach is mostly in a natural state, a fisherman’s beach that is unspoiled by tourist vendors, beach chairs, bars and restaurants.

A good selection of eateries and pubs are available on the beach road for your dining and entertainment pleasure.

The distance from our resort to Sam Roi Yod beach is 16 km and takes about 20 minutes driving time.

Wat sam roi yod (temple)

This temple is 22 kilometers away from our resort and about 25 minutes drive.



Wat Khao Deang (temple)

Surrounded by beautiful mountain, this temple is about 29 km away, 30 minutes driving time.

Around 32 km from Chang Noi resort, about half an hour drive.



Forest Park of Pak Nam Pran (Sirinart Rajini Ecosystem Learning Center)

A small mangrove forest park about 3.2 km², situated in Pran Buri District. The park is popular for its mangrove forest walk and birds.

Followed by a visit from the Thai Royal Family, the park was established as a forest recovery project in 1982. The park area was partly shrimp farms, after a successful program the farms were turned into forest.

The forests in the park are mainly mangrove, mixed deciduous and pine trees along the coast. The mangrove forests are next to the Pran Buri River where the river reaches the Gulf of Thailand, consequently affected by the tides.

The main attraction of the park is a km long boardwalk over the mangrove forests.



Night market at Pranburi Walking Street

This night market is opened every Saturday from 16:00 until about 22:00 and has a lot to offer in terms of local atmosphere (not many tourists in sight), a lot of different options when it comes to street food, a few bars, things to look at, to buy, local live music, karaoke etc.

This market is located next to Pranburi railway station about 10 min. drive from our resort.
